- ▶ Founded in 1992, Roma Tre University has gained a significant reputation in the academic community thanks to its high-quality teaching and research programmes. ### The Urban Campus: Knowledge Hubs in the City's Heart


- ▶ Roma Tre University revitalises Rome's industrial past, transforming historic sites into spaces for research and learning. The Law Department is housed in the former San Paolo Glassware factory, and Foreign Literatures occupies the old Alfa Romeo showroom. Mathematics and Physics reside in a repurposed parachute factory, while Engineering is based in a former naval tank. Architecture inhabits the historic slaughterhouse in Testaccio, fostering a dynamic cultural and academic hub. Extending across Ostiense, Garbatella, Termini, and Testaccio, Roma Tre also reaches Ostia, where its programmes in Ocean Engineering engage with sustainable marine and coastal development.

### Expanding Spaces for Learning

- ▶ Roma Tre University has expanded remarkably, now spanning over 400,000 m<sup>2</sup> from an initial 12,000 m<sup>2</sup>. This extensive space includes well-equipped classrooms, advanced laboratories, comprehensive libraries, and faculty offices, all set in an environment that encourages education and research. Enhancing this academic setting, students and staff enjoy comprehensive sports facilities such as the Alfredo Berra stadium and Le Torri Sports Club, which offer a variety of team sports including football, sailing, padel, and table tennis.







## Roma Tre in the World


